



Partial Class Enrollment

What is partial enrollment at Calvary Schools of Holland?

Partial enrollment applies to any student who is enrolled in up to four academic classes.

Why does Calvary Schools of Holland offer partial enrollment to students?

Calvary Schools of Holland seeks to assist the Christian home school community in their endeavor to biblically educate their children by offering a variety of academic and non-academic courses to home school students. We believe education and discipline are ultimately issues of parenthood. As a school we do not seek to take the place of parents, but to assist them in their role by providing educational services.

What classes are offered for partial enrollment?

Calvary offers a variety of academic and non-academic secondary courses that students may enroll in. Students who complete academic classes will receive credit for the course and be recorded in their cumulative file.

What is the cost for partial enrollment?

The tuition per academic class is \$525.00 per semester plus additional book fees which will vary according to the class.

Tuition for a non-academic course is \$265.00 per semester.

Singing Crusaders is offered to third through sixth grade students for \$175.00 per semester. This price excludes the cost of trips and activities.

Power Plus meets once a week and may be taken for \$575.00 per year. Because of the nature of the program, we ask that students be enrolled for the entire year.

Winterim classes are considered a one semester class. Cost for Winterim is \$265.00.

Full payment for the semester for all classes is expected before classes may be attended. If, for any reason, a student cannot continue with an educational program, a pro-rated refund will be returned.

What is Power-Plus?

Power Plus occurs every Wednesday beginning with Chapel. This includes student-lead worship singing and the area's best speakers. Following chapel, students meet with an assigned small group. These groups are gender specific and remain consistent throughout the student's career. The groups' adult leaders are committed to the discipleship of their students. Each small group is assigned to a ministry for 9 weeks. Groups are bussed to various ministries or service organizations to serve for 90 minutes.

By the end of a school year, each secondary student is disciplined for 45 hours beyond chapel and bible class and will have at least 60 hours of hands-on ministry experience. A senior who has attended Calvary Power Plus since sixth grade will graduate with 315 hours of discipleship time with 420 hours of ministry experience.

What is Winterim?

Winterim is a two-week long program scheduled at the end of the first semester in January. Secondary students are able to enroll in two-half day courses worth .50 credit each.

How do I register my child for partial enrollment?

Schedule an appointment to meet with the Executive Director and the Academic Dean.

Complete an application for admission to Calvary Schools of Holland. Please be sure to indicate the class(es) that you are interested in enrolling your child in.

Provide Calvary with a copy of your child's birth certificate and immunization record.

When should I apply?

The best time to apply for the following year is mid-January through April. However, students may enroll anytime before the beginning of a new semester provided there are openings in the desired course.

What else do I need to know before enrolling my child in classes at Calvary?

Calvary seeks to work with families who are members of a local Christian Church. Just as we look to assist families with their educational needs, we also strive to assist with their spiritual needs. It is our goal to build Christian character and to train student leaders. Calvary is deliberate in its approach at incorporating the Bible, worship, and godly characteristics into each subject that is taught. God's Word is central in all areas of the classroom.

Students who enroll in individual classes are considered part-time and will not be eligible for a diploma from Calvary.

It is our desire to preserve an atmosphere of purity and reverence for God and respect for authority. In order to achieve this, the following policies are established:

1. Calvary reserves the right to attain student records from any previous schools and/or educational program.
2. Calvary must be informed of any allergies, medication needs, and/or mental, emotional, or physical conditions or handicaps before enrollment.
3. Students may be tested to assure proper grade/class assignment.

Calvary Schools of Holland reserves the right to discontinue educational services for educational, behavioral, or spiritual reasons.

1. Educational: the student is unable to complete work assignments, and is not benefiting from instruction or lesson.
2. Behavioral: the student, through their action and/or attitude, is taking away from the educational environment for other students.
3. Spiritual: the student does not demonstrate a regard for Biblical principles or the spiritual dynamics of the class.
